



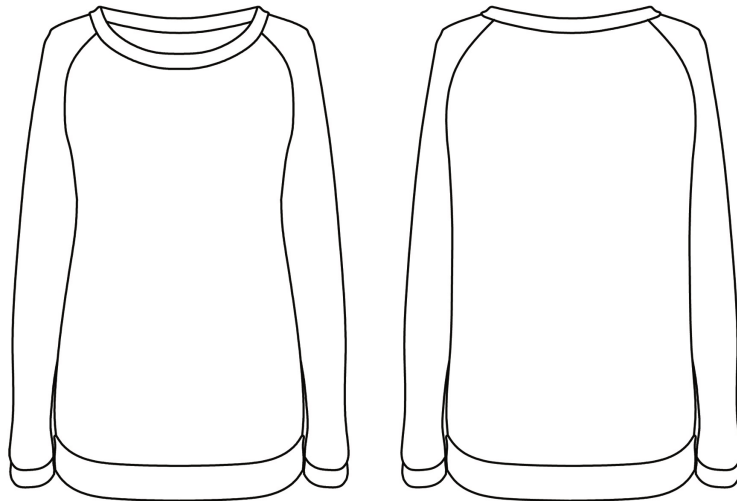
## Jagua - The Tattooed Sweatshirt

## design



A comfortable must have in your wardrobe: Jagua the sweatshirt

Long raglan sleeves.

The back is tattooed with geometrical and decorative embroidery

This day-to-day design is endlessly reproducible. To wear with feminine accessories for a casual look or to match with jeans and sneakers for sporting days.



## size chart

\* Measure the bust at breast level and parallel to the ground.

\* Measure the waist where the rib cage is hollow, on top of the navel.

\* Measure the full hips at the height of the buttocks.

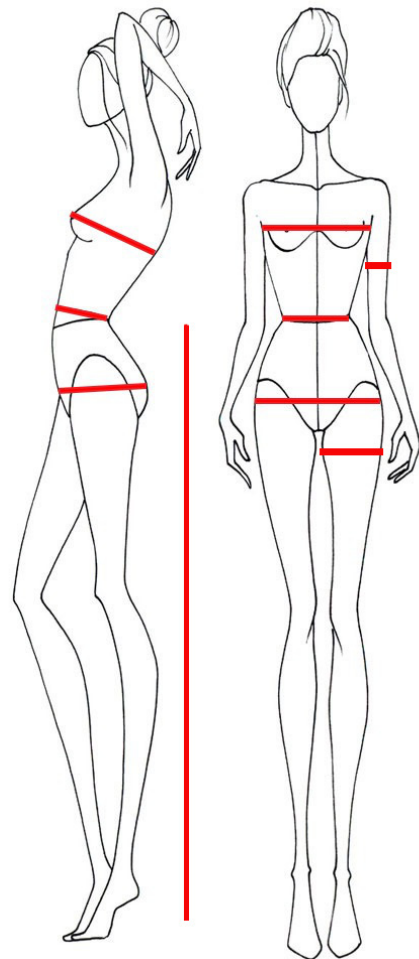
\* Measure the back from one armpit to the other.

\* Measure the arm width at the height of the upper arm.

\* Measure the arm length from the shoulder joint to the wrist.

\* Measure the legs from the waist down to the floor.

\* Measure the thigh circumference 10cm underneath the crotch.





## supplies

For this model, you will need a knitted fabric for it to be stretchy.

Jersey, duffle, t-shirt fabric or any other knitted fabric.

If you wish to realize the tattooed embroidery, also choose a thread contrasting with the fabric.

Here, I chose a golden thread.

You could also choose a contrasting welt to hem the bottom, the cuffs and the collar.

## caption & abbreviation

right/right : right sides together

right/wrg : right side on wrong side

wrg/wrg : wrong sides together

**WRONG SIDE OF THE FABRIC**

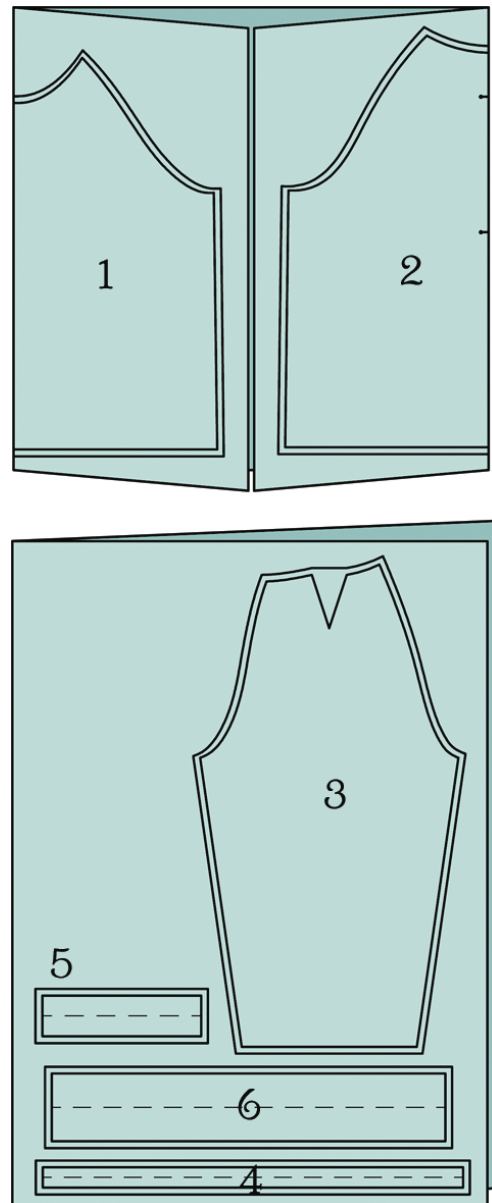


## cutting layouts

Advice: wash your fabric before cutting it to prevent it from shrinking once put together and washed for the first time. To do so, topstitch the edges of the cut fabric and put it in your washing machine set to the program adapted to the type of fabric. Once sewn, use the same washing program.

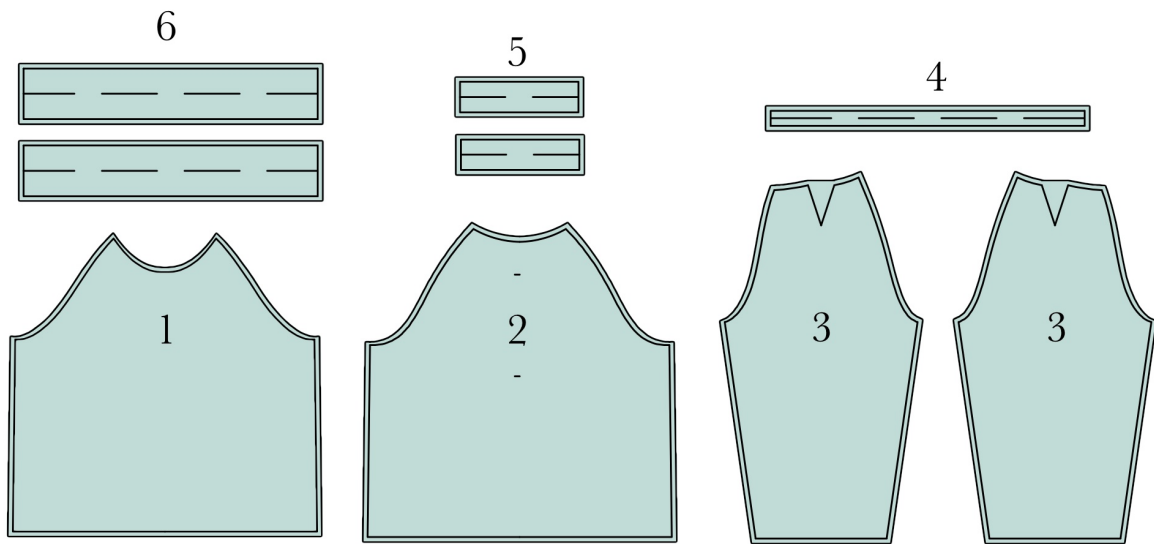
Seam allowances are not included in the pattern. For this model, add 1cm everywhere.

1. FRONT: cut 1 on fold
2. BACK: cut 1 on fold
3. SLEEVE: cut 2
4. COLLAR: cut 1
5. CUFF: cut 2
6. HEM: cut 2





## inventory



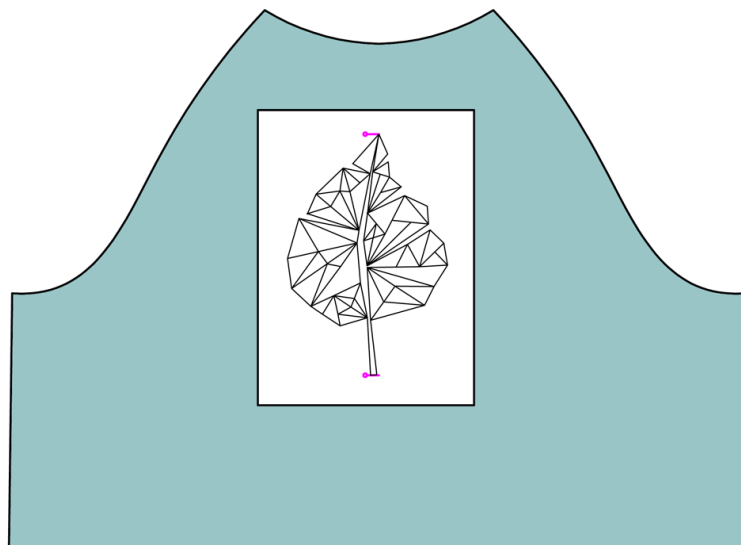
## clean-finish edges

The jersey does not fray. Therefore, there is no need to clean-finish the edges.

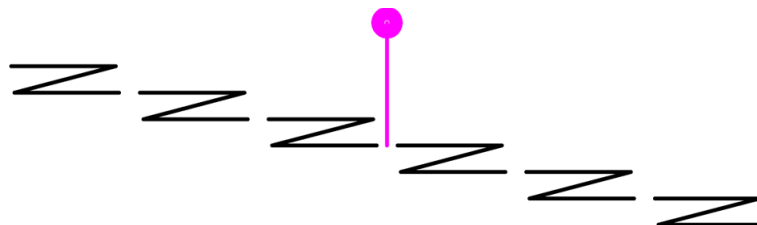
## sew along

### 1. THE TATTOOED EMBROIDERY

- Pin the pattern printed on a paper sheet on the right side of the back between the “T” markings.



- Stitch the drawing sheet through the paper and the jersey: you stitch the sheet with the stretch stitch (triple stitch). Start with the line 1 round marking. Follow the order of the lines and spin in the angles. To spin in the angles, respect the rhythm of the stretch stitch (triple stitch): the needle makes 2 points forwards and 1 point backwards. Spin after the first of the two forward points.



At times, you will have to go over already stitched lines.

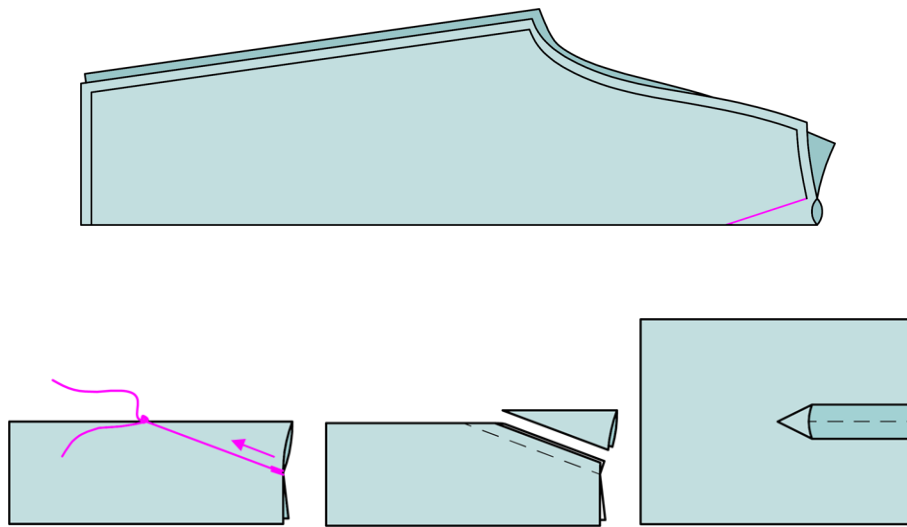
For a nice result, remember to link your extremities or intersections.

- To take it out, tear the paper between the seams. Tweezers can be useful.

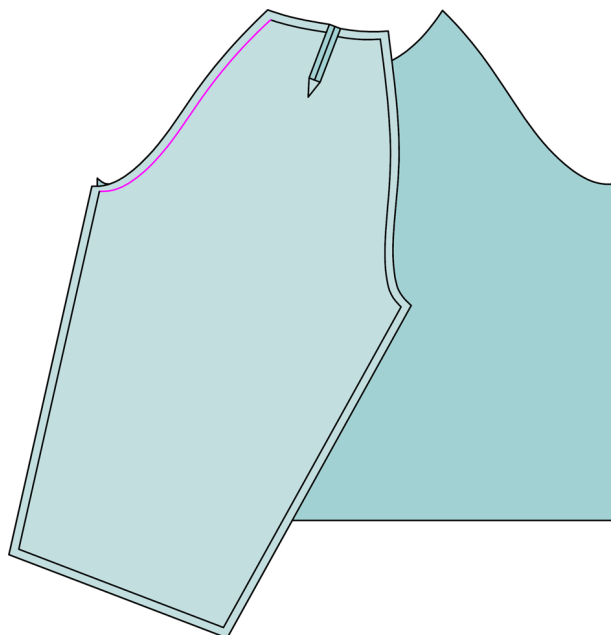


## 2. THE SWEATSHIRT ASSEMBLY

- Do the pleats at the top of the sleeves: fold the fabric right/right and line up the two lines of the dart. Start stitching by the large part of the dart and going to the peak. Pull the needle out of the fabric without realizing a stop stitch. Cut the thread leaving 10cm out. Tie the threads by hand. Cut the threads and the allowances at 5mm from the seam. Press allowances and the peak to open.



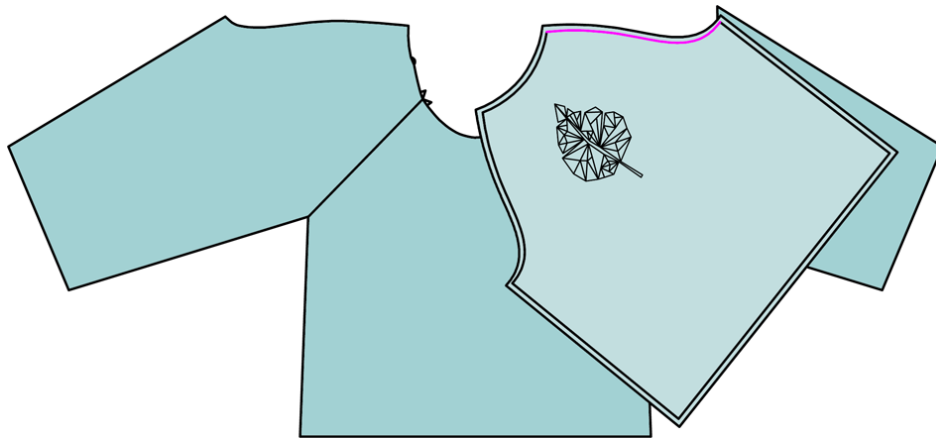
- Pin the sleeves' front with the front part of the sweatshirt right/right. Stitch the armholes. Press seams to open.



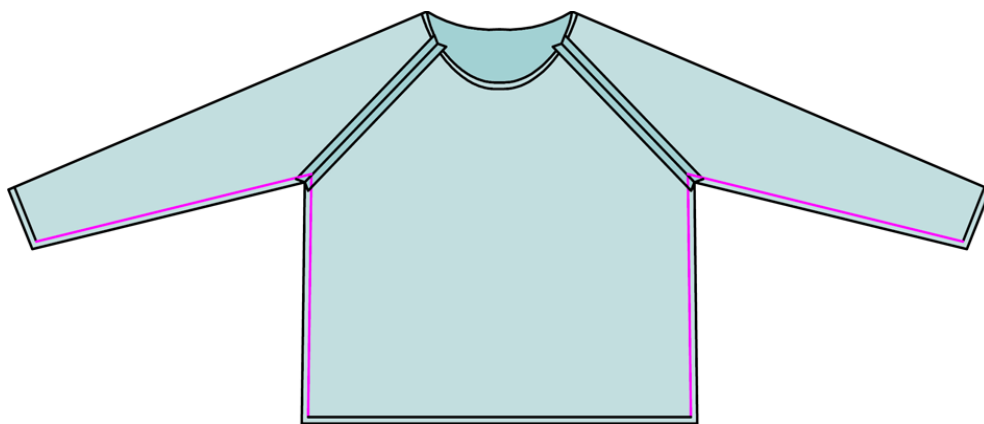




- Pin the sleeves' back with the back part of the sweatshirt right/right. Stitch the armholes. Press seams to open.

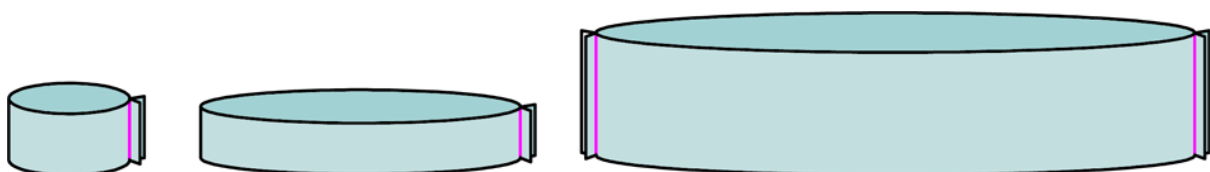


- Fold the sleeves right/right to pin the front and the back of the sweatshirt together. Stitch the sides of the garment and of the sleeves by pivoting in the angle.



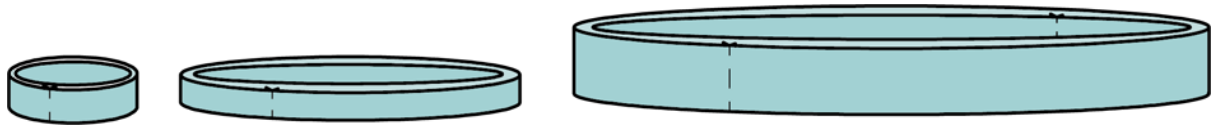
### 3. THE HEMS

- Stitch the hem strips right/right. Stitch the sides. Press seams to open.
- Fold the cuffs and the collar in two right/right to form a circle. Stitch the sides. Press seams to open.

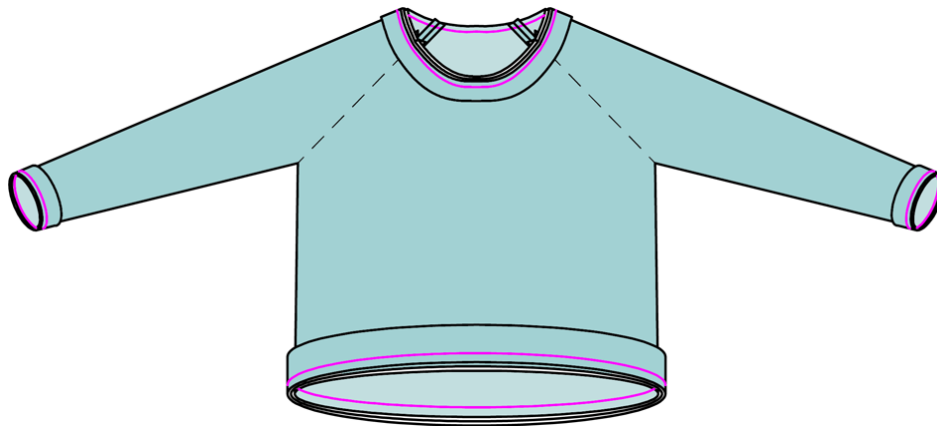




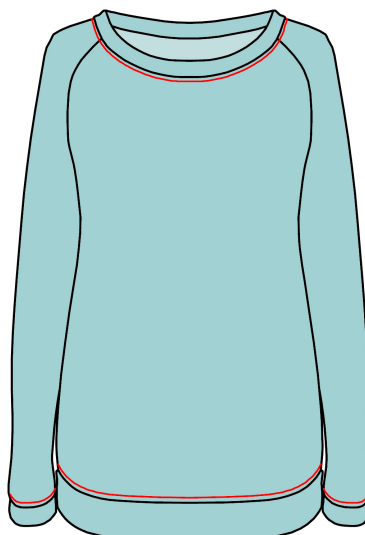
- Fold each piece in two wrg/wrg lengthwise. Press to mark the fold.



- Pin each strip with the garment rght/rght and open edge with the seam allowances. The finish strips are shorter than the garment. Therefore, first pin the seams with the seams, then the middle with the middle and finish by pinning the rest while slightly pulling the strips to align them with the garment. Stitch the circumference with the stretch stitch (cf. your sewing machine instructions manual) while slightly pulling your fabric to avoid pleats.



- Fold down the finishing strips and press them.
- To maintain them, topstitch at 2mm from the previous seam.
